Bureau of Prisons Receives Recognition from the Department of Treasury

On April 2, 2013, the Department of Treasury, Bureau of Fiscal Service, thanked and recognized the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) for its participation in the Centralized Receivables Service (CRS) program. CRS is a Treasury initiative designed to help better manage receivables, reduce delinquencies and write-offs, and leverage electronic collection opportunities. The Bureau is the first agency in the pilot program and began using CRS in January 2013 to manage the reimbursements for the cost of care and custody of state prisoners confined in federal facilities. Commissioner David Lebryk presented Director Charles E. Samuels, Jr. with a certificate during the recognition ceremony.

BOP employees attend Reentry Court Program briefing

On February 19, 2013, staff from FPC Pensacola, FCI Tallahassee, FCC Coleman, FCI Marianna, several United States Probation Offices, and several United States Attorney's Offices attended a Reentry Court meeting in Pensacola, Florida.

The Honorable M. Casey Rodgers, Chief Judge for the Northern District of Florida, hosted the meeting and provided the guests with a brief overview of the history of the Reentry Court Program. The overview included a demonstration of tools and resources used to facilitate the program, such as Staff Training Aimed at Reducing Re-arrest (STARR), Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), and Post-Conviction Risk Assessment (PCRA).

Chief USPO visits BOP Juvenile Contract Facility in New Mexico

On March 28, 2013, the Chief United States Probation Officer, for the District of New Mexico, Anita Chavez, and Supervisory United States Probation Officer, Margaret Vigil, visited the BOP juvenile contract facility, American Marine Institute for kids-Sandoval, in Cuba, New Mexico (AMikids-Sandoval). They discussed juvenile reentry needs with BOP Residential Reentry Contract Specialist Luz Lujan and the Director of AMikids-Sandoval. The non-secure facility houses male juveniles and provides them a minimum of 50 hours of programming weekly. This programming includes year-round education, recreation, vocational training, substance abuse treatment, and other treatment based on individual needs.

'Letters from Dad' program at FCC Petersburg

On March 8, 2013, FCC Petersburg Medium held a commencement ceremony for 30 inmates who completed the "Letters from Dad" program. This program is a five month faith-based class that offers instruction on the art of letter writing. In the class, each participant must complete "Letters of Blessings" to their spouse, children and parents. During the commencement ceremony, the program participants were provided the opportunity to read one of their letters and present letters to their family members. There were 28 adult visitors and 10 children who attended the ceremony.
